#### **NOTICE!**

#### **GENERAL RULES**

- 1. All exhibitors agree to be bound by rules and regulations of Perry County Community Fair Association.
- 2. The management reserves the right to amend or add to those rules as the Executive Committee in its judgement may determine.
- 3. Reasonable care will be taken to protect all exhibits on display from injury and damage but the Association is not in any way to be held responsible for accidents, or damage by water, fire, theft or otherwise, whatever may be the cause or extent of damage or loss.
- 4. We are not responsible for printing errors.
- 5. Entries will be made according to classification and ribbons for 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th place will be awarded. (Not all ribbons will be dated.)
- 6. Premiums will be paid to Four Places, unless otherwise stated.
- 7. When a Livestock Exhibitor enters more than one exhibit in a class and places more than one time, the Perry County Community Fair will pay a maximum of two premiums.
- 8. No premiums are guaranteed in classes with less than three (3) entries. The judge may give an exhibit second or third prize if not deemed worthy of first. The decision of the judges will be final.
- 9. All products exhibited must have been produced or made by the Exhibitor since last years Perry County Fair.
- 10. The Fair Association will not be responsible for weight of anything sold on grounds.
- 11. Department superintendents of all departments have the right to reject an entry of poor quality, too large and cumbersome for the staff to handle, an accident hazard or any other, deemed necessary.
- 12. All exhibits except livestock, to be placed between 10 a.m. and 8 p.m., Monday week of the Perry County Community Fair.
- 13. Exhibits may be limited to Perry County, available space or any condition beyond the control of the Perry County Community Fair. Exhibitors would be notified prior to entry day.
- 14. Pennsylvania Dept. of Agriculture has developed 4-H and Department 11 with classes so Youth (ages 8 under 19) can compete at Pennsylvania County Fairs. Exhibitors entering "PERRY COUNTY COMMUNITY FAIR" sponsored classes must be 8 years of age. Youth entering at the Perry County Community Fair must list age and birth date on their Entry Form, to be eligible for Premium Money.
- 15. Best of Show Ribbons Department/Section Outstanding Exhibit
- 16. Home & Produce Building will be CLOSED Tuesday Fair Week from 8am 6pm for JUDGING

#### 17. NO EXHIBIT IS TO BE REMOVED BEFORE SUNDAY BETWEEN 10 A.M. TO 2 P.M.

#### **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

- 1. Competition open, except in cases otherwise specified.
- All exhibits entered for competition must have been owned by the exhibitor at least sixty days previous to the Fair.
- Fruits, grains, vegetables, flowers, etc., must have been grown by the exhibitors and all manufactured goods must have been made by the competitor.
- 4. No article or animal can compete for more than one premium, except in trials of speed and specials.
- Exhibits and concession space must be paid in full by July 29, 2023
- Any exhibitor violating rules may be subject to forfeiture of all entry fees and premiums won.
- All articles of exhibition must be respected as private property and any person detected purloining or injuring them will be dealt with according to law.
- 8. This Association assumes no responsibility in case of loss or damage to stock or other exhibits, from any cause, and upon this conduct their business or exhibit that the public shall not be liable to injury. In case anyone is injured, the privilege renter or exhibitor shall assume all responsibility, therefore, shall indemnify the Exposition for any and all expenses occasioned by such an accident or injury.
- 9. Exhibitors are required to give personal attention to their property and animals and at the close of the Exposition to see to their removal; only on this condition are entries received and the Association will not assume any liability for personal injury sustained by any person entering the ground. All persons renting privileges upon the grounds and all exhibitors of livestock, machinery etc., must so attend to their removal, as the Association will not assume further responsibility. Exhibitors must produce their duplicate cards to the Superintendent in charge before attempting to remove their property.

- Exhibitors or Agent in Department 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 must be present on day judged to show their stock in the ring provided when being judged.
- A penalty will be imposed on exhibitors who knowingly exhibit diseased stock
- 12. A license to vend goods and wares, or to give exhibitions on the grounds during the Fair will be granted by the Superintendent of Privileges upon payment of such fees as may be determined, and without such license no person shall be permitted to give an exhibition for personal profit, or expose any article for sale or delivery on the grounds.
- No Alcoholic Beverages or Illegal Drugs will be permitted on the grounds.
- No unlicensed gambling or gambling devices will be allowed or permitted upon or in the vicinity of the Fair Grounds.
- 15. All stand renters must, during the day, deposit their garbage and offals in cans provided, which will be removed by the Association. A penalty will be imposed for violation of this rule, as all stands will be inspected daily.
- No disorderly conduct of any kind will be permitted. A police force will be upon the grounds sufficient to prevent the same and see that all rules and regulations are strictly observed.
- 17. All exhibitors' and concessionaires' cars and trucks must be parked outside of the exhibit concession area unless permission is granted by the manager. Right reserved to impose fines and penalties to maintain order and to refuse and return any or all entries.
- 18. No other rabbits on fairgrounds except those entered in fair.
- 19. No bicycle on grounds during fair week.
- Positively no dogs on Fairgrounds during fair hours. No dogs permitted in the Livestock area at all during fair week.

#### **EDITORS AND FAIR OFFICERS**

The management appreciates all courtesies of members of the press, local and in other towns and cities, and will be glad to meet such as may find it convenient to attend the Fair. Admissions will be cheerfully furnished to publishers, editors or those chosen representatives presenting proper credentials to the Secretary.

#### GENERAL LIVESTOCK REGULATIONS

- Exhibitors must furnish evidence of registration of all animals entered as purebreds. Registration papers will be checked on all entries. All breeding animals have to be registered in order to be exhibited.
- All stock must be placed by 12 p.m. on Tuesday, August 15, 2023, unless noted below. Breeding beef and steers may arrive Monday, August 14, 2023, 4:00-6:00 p.m. All breeding stock may be removed Saturday, August 19, 2023 between 9:00 a.m. 12:00 p.m. Animals not removed by noon can depart after 10:00 p.m. Exhibitors who remove animals from the fairgrounds before release deadline will forfeit premiums. All animals must be removed by 8 a.m. on Sunday, August 20, 2023.
- 3. Entry forms can be obtained from the Extension Office. All entries are to be mailed to the Perry County Extension Office, P.O. Box 129, New Bloomfield, PA 17068. Entry fee of \$4.00 per head must accompany entry form. Checks should be made payable to Perry County Fair. Deadline for entries is Friday, July 29, 2023 at 4:00 p.m. Failure to meet the above deadline or not enclosing payment will cause disqualification. There will be no substitutions allowed for market animal entries. Substitutions are allowed for breeding stock.
- 4. Exhibitors showing one head or more shall be entitled to 2 exhibitor's passes per family.
- Youth and Open shows will occur at the same time. Youth exhibitors will receive open show ribbons and premiums for placing in the open show, but will receive only ribbons indicating placing in the youth show
- Straw, hay and other feed will be provided by the exhibitor of the animal. Each exhibitor is responsible for the feeding, watering and care of their animal in a humane manner, and must also keep their exhibit area clean and neat.
- 7. Three animals of a breed must be shown to select a Grand Champion or Reserve Champion.
- 8. Animals with natural horns, disbudded or dehorned may be shown.
- All exhibitors of animals will be assigned barn and pen space by the respective species committees and/or superintendents. Animals may not be unloaded or placed in assigned areas until checked and approved by the species representative.
- 10. In order to qualify for showmanship class premium, exhibitors must show their own entries.
- 11. Market animals will be weighed on Monday, August 14, 2023, as per schedule to be determined by the Livestock Committee. Weighmaster will be appointed by the Perry County Fair Board. Weight at that time is the official weight; reweighing will not be allowed. Any market animal over or under the official weight is disqualified from open shows. Unless the animal is a 4-H or FFA project, it must be removed from the fairgrounds immediately. 4-H and FFA animals may remain to participate in their respective shows and sale on Saturday provided that:
  - A. If a 4-H or FFA member carried more than one animal in a species; only the animal making weight may remain on the grounds.
  - B. If all animals in a species fail to make weight, only one animal per species may remain on the grounds.
- 12. By entering livestock in the Perry County Fair, the owners and exhibitors of such animals agree to abide by all rules of the Perry County Fair and its code of IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics. Failure to comply could result in expulsion from the show. Decisions of this rule will be made by the Fair Board Livestock Committee and the Fair Species Superintendent.
- 13. For safety reasons no children under 8 years old will be permitted to show Swine, Beef or Dairy Cows. All showmen under age 8 must be able to show without assistance.
- Showmanship classes are based upon age of youth exhibitor as of January 1, 2023.
- For any animal exhibit that dies on the fairgrounds the department superintendent must be notified.

## IAFE NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

- All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership. length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
- Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
- Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
- Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of volatile drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes. regulations and rules. If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise. At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.
- 5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoof or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.

- The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
- 7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
- 8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
- The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
- 10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of this Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notice to members.
- 11. The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

#### Youth Market Livestock Regulations

- 1. All youth exhibiting market livestock in the youth livestock show must belong to the Perry County 4-H Livestock Club having passed their 8th but not their 19th birthday and/or a Perry County FFA Chapter and have not passed their 19th birthday as of January 1, 2023. FFA members who exceed the age limit but are in high school may complete their project work. Membership/students must abide by the rules set forth by their youth organizations.
- 2. No substitutions of market livestock will be made. Only the animals initially tagged and placed on feed for consideration of exhibition can be shown in the junior market livestock show. Youth livestock exhibitors may enter up to 4 market lambs, 4 market goats, 4 market hogs and 2 steers on the official entry form. Exhibitors may only exhibit 2 market lambs, 2 market goats, 2 market hogs and 1 steer. Only animals entered on the official entry form are eligible for exhibition. All entries on the entry form must be accompanied by the \$4.00 per head fee.
- Exhibitor may select a substitute show person only in the event
  of illness, injury, double entries in a single class, conflicting fair
  events and college attendance. The substitute show person must
  be a current member of the Perry County 4-H Livestock Club or
  a Perry County FFA Chapter.
- 4. Animals consigned for slaughter immediately after the show shall not receive any treatment with drugs or biologics within the withdrawal time necessary prior to slaughter. Important--If upon slaughter, treatment with drugs, biologics or any chemical from fitting products, is the cause of condemnation of a carcass, the loss of the carcass and any other damages will be borne by the exhibitor.

- 5. All youth show market animals, making weight, exhibited at the Perry County Fair will sell at the junior market livestock sale held during fair week. All market animals under or over weight must go to the buy-back program and will not run through the sale.
- All junior exhibitors will comply with the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics, and the Code of Conduct of their various 4-H and/or FFA programs. Failure to comply could result in expulsion from the show.
- 7. Conflicts involving Perry County Fair Rules pertaining to FFA youth entries will be resolved by the Livestock Committee Chair of the Fair Board along with the species superintendent and the student's vocational agriculture teacher. Violations of rules particular to FFA programs will be dealt with by the vocational agriculture teachers.

STEER - Youth steer projects must be tagged with a Perry County Youth Fair tag. Steers must be placed on feed and in possession of the exhibitor by November 2022. Tagging will be done under the supervision of the 4-H leader or FFA instructor. Exhibitors may place 2 steers on feed. Only one steer may be entered in the fair. Youth exhibitors will be asked to demonstrate their ability to handle the steer to their leader(s) and/or instructor(s) prior to exhibition at the fair. Steers must weigh a minimum of 1,050 lbs. Farm Show Steer, with proper identification may be weighed and shown - Exhibition only.

SWINE - Youth swine projects must be tagged with Perry County Youth Fair tags and placed on feed and in possession of the exhibitor with records kept prior to May 13, 2023. Tagging will be done under the supervision of the 4-H leader or FFA instructor. Exhibitors may place 4 market hogs on feed. Only 2 market hogs per exhibitor may be exhibited at the fair. The weight range for market hogs is 230-280 pounds.

SHEEP - Youth market lamb projects must be tagged with Perry County Youth Fair tags and placed on feed and in possession of the exhibitor with records kept prior to May 13, 2023. Tagging will be done under the supervision of the 4-H leader or FFA instructor. Exhibitors may place 4 market lambs on feed. Only 2 market lambs per exhibitor may be exhibited at the fair. The weight range for market lambs is 80-150 pounds. Market lambs must be slick shorn from the knee and the hock up at the time of weighing. Lambs with excessive wool will not be weighed until shorn to the satisfaction of the sheep superintendent.

GOATS - Youth market goat projects must be tagged with Perry County Youth Fair tags and placed on feed and in possession of the exhibitor with records kept prior to May 13, 2023. Tagging will be done under the supervision of the 4-H leader or FFA instructor. Exhibitors may place 4 market goats on feed. Only 2 market goats per exhibitor may be exhibited in the fair. The weight range for market goats is 60-110 pounds.

8. Fitting rule - Open and youth market animals being exhibited - No paint products are to be used for shows. No fitting products are to be used on sale night, only soap and water.

#### 2023 PENNSYLVANIA FAIR ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

## ENFORCED AT THE 2023 PERRY COUNTY COMMUNITY FAIR

Following are the health rules for all animal exhibits at the Perry County Fair. Any animal developing contagious or infectious disease symptoms during the fair will be excused from the fair immediately.

#### PENNSYLVANIA SWINE:

#### Requirements:

- A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) must be issued within 14 days of exhibition.
- All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (the statement is pre-printed on the CVI). Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.

Has been visually inspected and be found free of signs of contagious disease immediately prior to unloading at the exhibition by an accredited veterinarian or swine health monitor appointed by the fair board.

- 3. Individual animal ID is required.
  - Is permanently identified by an official 840 series radio frequency identification (RFID) ear tag and ear tag is recorded on the CVI.

#### **PENNSYLVANIA CATTLE:**

#### Requirements:

- A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) must be issued after May 1, 2023.
- All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (the statement is pre-printed on the CVI). Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.
- 3. Individual official animal identification is required. Official ID includes:
  - A USDA issued National Uniform Eartagging System (NUES) tag
  - À 15 digit Animal Identification Number (AIN ear tag starting with "840"
  - · Other identification approved by the PDA
- 4. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is required for animals 3 months of age and older (market cattle are exempt from this vaccination requirement). A copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable.

#### **GOATS:**

#### Requirements:

- A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) must be issued after May 1, 2023.

  - A legible tattoo with herd and individual identification is recognized in an approved USDA Scrapie database
  - A breed registration tattoo if the animal is accompanied by a registration certificate and tattoo is legible
  - · Identification must be permanently affixed to individual animal

#### SHEEP:

#### Requirements:

- A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) must be issued after May 1, 2023.
- All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (the statement is pre-printed on he CVI). Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.
- Individual official USDA scrapie animal identification is required. Official ID includes:
  - A USDA ear tag with a US shield; which includes scrapie program tags. Animals bearing identification with blue colored scrapie program tags are not permitted to be exhibited in PA.
  - A legible tattoo with herd and individual identification is recognized in an approved USDA Scrapie database
  - A breed registration tattoo if the animal is accompanied by a registration certificate and tattoo is legible
  - · Identification must be permanently affixed to individual animal
- 4. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is required for animals 3 months of age and older (market cattle are exempt from this vaccination requirement). A copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable.

#### **PENNSYLVANIA RABBITS:**

#### Requirements:

- Rabbits showing any signs of sickness or disease will not be permitted.
- 2. Any rabbits developing sickness shall be removed from the fairgrounds after notifying the fair office.
- Toenails must be trimmed prior to check-in. Rabbits must be presented to Rabbit Committee at check-in before being placed in assigned cages.
- 4. Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease (RHD) is a highly contagious disease caused by a calicivirus. Prior to 2020 it was assumed that the virus only affected rabbits of the Oryctolagus cuniculus species. This includes wild and domestic European rabbits, which our domesticated rabbits are descended from. However, a new variant of the virus is now able to infect North American native rabbits or hares, such as our cottontails, snowshoe hares, or jackrabbits. Based on ongoing confirmed cases within the USA the ARBA has the following recommendations. The fair board will cancel show within a 50 mile radius, which had a confirmed outbreak of RCV/RHD/VHD in domestic rabbits within the past 30 days of the entry deadline.

#### **DOGS FOR EXHIBITION:**

- A current rabies vaccination is required for all exhibition dogs three months of age and older. All vaccine label directions must be followed.
- 2. All rabies vaccinated dogs must be accompanied by a rabies vaccination certificate which must contain information fields consistent with the current version of the National Association of State Public Health Veterinarians Rabies Compendium (including, but not limited to, animal identification, breed, sex, age and color; the vaccination tag number; the vaccine name, lot number, duration of immunity, and manufacturer; and the date of vaccination). and must be accurately and legibly completed. The certificate must contain legible name, contact information, and signature of the veterinarian who administered the vaccine. A copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is acceptable.
- All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases. Animals appearing unhealthy upon arrival may not enter the exhibition grounds.

- Exhibitors of livestock must inform themselves as to when the stock will be judged. Stock must be in the right ring promptly on call and a failure to comply with the order renders exhibitors liable to be ruled out of competing at the discretion of the Superintendent.
- Decorations with ribbons or ornaments previously worn by animals at shows shall be prohibited until after the awards have been made in their respective classes by the judge.
- The judge will select the two best udders from each class to be shown in class 27.
- Herd rule shall apply for all group classes, premier exhibitors and breeders.
- Class 30-Exhibitor defined. An individual who is housing the animals, with verification provided by an official health certificate or official DHI sheet, will be considered the exhibitor for Class 30.
- Substitutions for dairy animals entered on the fair entry sheet are permitted.

- 10. The fair will issue one premium check per entry in group classes. If the exhibited group is comprised of animals from multiple owners; it is the responsibility of the owners to divide the premium.
